

# A Call for Abstracts

The NENA Conference Committee invites you to submit an abstract for possible inclusion in the 'Moving Mountains' Conference Program.

All abstracts must be submitted online at the Conference Website: [www.nena.org.au/conference](http://www.nena.org.au/conference).

## Content

- All submitted abstracts should relate to the conference themes listed below
- Abstracts for presentation at the conference must not exceed 250 words and presentations must not exceed 20 minutes in length. Strict time limits will be enforced.

Presentations may be supported by a laptop computer but must be available on CD ROM or USB drive. Presenters using either the on-site laptop or their own laptop must check in with the on-site audio visual technicians prior to presenting to ensure that there are no technical problems. More detailed instructions and an audio/visual checklist will be made available to presenters once abstracts have been accepted.

## Submission:

The final date for submission of abstracts is April 30, 2010. Abstracts received after this date will not be accepted. Acceptance or otherwise is at the discretion of the Conference Committee. The presenting author will be advised in writing of the Committee's decision within 14 day of the closing date. No further correspondence will be entered into regarding the acceptance or rejection of abstracts after the decision has been made.

All presenting authors must register for the conference. The earlybird registration fee will apply to the authors of accepted abstracts.

All abstracts will be considered on the basis of the merit of the individual submission and will be ranked according to the following criteria:

- Relevance to conference themes
- Innovative research
- Benefit to the conference participants

## Themes:

### The key themes for the conference will include:

- How do Enrolled Nurses effect change?
- How have changes to healthcare delivery inspired your practice?
- As an Enrolled/Division2 nurse in your workplace what is your motivation?
- Is Enrolled Nurse education effecting change?
